This will help us to write a plan that:


• Is best for everyone.

Why Hoylake Beach is important






Question 2: Please choose the most important things Hoylake Beach does for nature.

Sand dunes are small hills made of sand.

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
I want sand dunes across the whole area

I think having some sand




Question 5: How do you think Hoylake Beach should look?

Question 11: How much do you agree or disagree that we should choose an area of the beach that is looked after for people to use?


This area would have no plants and people could get to the beach from a managed path from the prom.

Question 13: How much do you agree or disagree that we should not look after the beach and just make sure there is a way for everyone to get to it from the prom?






Question 14: How much do you agree or disagree that we should support more plants to grow on the beach with no managed path from the prom?

This will cost the council more money to look after it.




Question 15: How much do you agree or disagree that sand should be moved out of the beach, which will cost the council money and cause more pollution?

Question 16: How much do you agree or disagree that we should manage the sand by taking it out of drains, roads and pavements so it doesn't cause damage?


This would cost the council money and cause more pollution.





Question 17: How much do you agree or disagree that we should manage the increase in sand a little, which would mean:


- Spending less.
