

## Swanage Neighbourhood Plan

Dorset Coast Forum has been appointed by Swanage Town Council to undertake engagement with the community to gather the community's views on the 8 proposed themes that will form the Swanage Neighbourhood Plan:

- Swanage Settlement
- Housing Mix
- Development Sites
- Town Centre
- Townscape Character
- Open Space and Recreation
- Local Green Spaces
- Community Facilities

The Draft Plan will then be produced shaped by the feedback collated during this initial engagement phase. The DRAFT PLAN will be shared during a formal consultation planned for early 2026.

A Neighbourhood Plan sets out policies for the use and development of land and, once approved in a local referendum, becomes part of the statutory development plan, meaning it must be considered when deciding planning applications.



There are several ways to **get involved** with this initial engagement to inform the Draft Plan:

- complete the online survey
- Drop-in to one of 4 community events this autumn and explore maps, displays and to talk to the DCF team in person. No booking needed, check out the Future Events section in this newsletter or on the project webpage

# Swanage Green Seafront Stabilisation and Shore Road Enhancement Scheme

DCF Project Officer Elaine had a super busy Round 2 Engagement Phase for the Swanage Green Seafront Stabilisation and Enhancement Project during the early summer with multiple public events and opportunities for the community to have their say.

Over 400 people attended our DCF hosted range of engagement events and the opportunity to complete the accompanying community survey was extensively utilised. We thank everyone who took the time to attend an event or complete the survey.

DCF are now currently analysing the collected data and preparing a report for Swanage Town Council. It is now anticipated by the town council that the stabilisation work is unlikely to begin before September 2027.
